Acupuncture study on hot flashes: Acupuncture may be a viable treatment for women experiencing hot flashes as a result of estrogen-targeting therapies to treat breast cancer, reports a new study from researchers at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. "Though most people associate hot flashes with menopause, the episodes also affect many breast cancer survivors who have low estrogen levels and often undergo premature

menopause, following treatment with chemotherapy or surgery," said lead author Jun J. Mao, MD, MSCE, Associate Professor of Family Medicine and Community Health at UPenn and SIO President-Elect. The findings were published in early September in the *Journal of Clinical Oncology*. > READ MORE
